Online Courses and Open School BC

Bringing online courses into BC classrooms is a great challenge. Increasing costs of course delivery systems and technical services makes it difficult for many districts to offer online options to their students and teachers.

Open School BC, the BC Ministry of Education, Distributed Electronic Learning Consortium, and the Consortium of Online Learning (COOL) have negotiated a two year, shared WebCT license available to school districts in British Columbia and Alberta starting July 2003. This license allows school districts providing online programs to access WebCT on a central server, which is hosted and technically supported by the Online Consortium Hosting Service (OCHS), a service of Open School BC.

Through the OCHS, school districts have the option to have their own courses hosted, to license the use of Open School BC courses for their learners, or, if a member COOL, to access the courses provided by this consortium.
