


# **MARINE ADVANTAGE**





CN Rail operates the largest rail network in Canada and the only transcontinental network covering the entire North American continent. This international rail line follows the uncongested Northwest Transportation Corridor along the lowest rail grade through the Canadian Rockies and on to rest of North America via Chicago. This results in faster operational times,

greater reliability and overall cost savings. With 17,821 route-miles, it is the only railway on the continent to serve ports on the Atlantic, the Pacific and the Gulf Coast.


# RELIABILITY, TIMING, REACH



The Port of Prince Rupert allows shippers to quickly and easily reach major cities and important markets in the Midwestern and Southern U.S., and across Canada. CN invested C\$390 million in 2007 in Prince Rupert upgrading tunnels; and building bridges, mile-long sidings, and acquiring 2,200 rail cars, and 50 new state-of-the-art locomotives. CN has also committed another C\$430 million in 2008. CN is now double tracked from Prince Rupert to Memphis; which give them the capacity to accommodate growth to 2020, including 4 million TEU's. Shippers can immediately access up to 80% of CN's high capacity state-ofthe-art Northern Line and benefit from the seamless integration of the full CN Rail network.

#### **TIMING**

CN rail has consistently delivered on-time service from the Port of Prince Rupert to the key US Midwest markets. Every train which has left Prince Rupert has been on schedule and arrived ahead of schedule.
